Following the initial session, Three Counties Radio covered the programme on their Friday night programme and this was then picked up by the <u>BBC</u>. This week we have also been contacted by ITV News about possibly covering the programme in the near future. We look forward to seeing the outcome of this exciting new programme over the weeks ahead.

The auditions for the musical Oliver are in full swing and the show is already shaping up to be another amazing extravaganza. We will have regular updates over the coming weeks.

In sport, we have had some great results, with the U16 girls basketball team gaining bronze in the county finals and the boys 1st XI beat

Windsor Boys 7-1 to gain a place in the quarter-finals of the national cup and the U14B team beat Boston School and then Bedford Academy to reach the last 8 in the country. The U14 girls rugby also beat Robert Clack B 37 - 29 in an exciting game of rugby which swung back and forth throughout the game and was a fantastic experience for all the girls involved. Finally, all four of our boys' rugby teams played St Josephs in a fantastic evening of rugby at Bedford Athletic Rugby Club. Despite the freezing cold weather, all four teams came away with victories and demonstrated yet again how far we have come over the last few years.

Finally, two incredibly talented students received amazing news this week with offers from Oxford and Cambridge. In addition, four students have received offers to study veterinary medicine. We are very proud of them all!

Top tips for looking after your ear health

There has been a lot of press recently about the lack of ear wax removal services available on the NHS, so our Audiologist Charlotte Chappell, answers some of the most common questions about how to look after your ears.

Why do we have ear wax?

Wax is a waterproof lining for your ear canal that helps protect your ears from infections and dryness which can cause irritation.

Should I use cotton buds to clean my ears?

Cotton buds are <u>not</u> recommended for cleaning your ears. They can push wax further into the ear canal, impacting the wax and potentially damaging the delicate ear drum leading to further complications.

How should I clean my ears?

The ears have a natural mechanism to self-clean, so wax and skin migrates from deeper in the ear canal to the outer ear. For most people, just leaving the ears alone is the best approach.

If you get a complete wax blockage, you can try and use medical grade olive oil (such as the Earol spray), to soften the wax for one week. You should not put anything in your ear to try and remove the blockage (cotton buds, hairgrips, pen lids, or knitting needles, just some of the things we have heard people confess to using over the years!) If the blockage in your ear doesn't improve after using olive oil, you will need professional wax removal.

Can you still have your ears syringed?

The old-fashioned ear syringing is no longer recommended as a safe way to remove wax, however wax removal completed by a trained specialist via water irrigation or micro-suction, can be performed safely to remove stubborn wax blockages.

Once the wax blockage is removed, the healthcare specialist can then examine your ears and might also be able to perform a hearing test.

How do I know if I have a wax blockage?

Some of the symptoms of a wax blockage include: hearing loss, earache, tinnitus (a ringing or buzzing noise in your ear), dizziness or a feeling of pressure in your ear.

If you are experiencing any of these symptoms, book an appointment with an Audiologist for advice and to check the health of your ears.
