The Tea & Chat sessions have seen a significant increase in attendees and on the last two occasions visitors have numbered 20; double that for earlier in the year. The programme for these sessions is much more varied than previously with games, quizzes and a sing along. Clifton All Saints Academy

I know I wrote an article for the Chronicles this time last year inviting anyone interested in becoming a governor at the school to contact me and I would like to thank those people who came forward at that time.



There have been changes in the Articles of Association for Academies and our Governors are now called Trustees. Governing boards meet regularly to look at the big picture and the school's long-term goals. They set the culture and values of the school, responding to opportunities and challenges. Governors and trustees work closely with the headteacher, supporting them and challenging them. Governors typically serve at schools that are maintained by the local authority whereas trustees serve on an academy trust board.

They are responsible for:

- developing a vision and strategy for the school
- overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent
- holding the school leader to account to ensure that every pupil has the best possible education
- engaging with pupils, staff, parents and the school community to understand their views

Activities can include:

- attending governing board meetings: these normally take place around six times a year and may be held outside school hours
- looking at information and evidence on the school's progress and discussing with school leaders
- visiting the school to see plans working in practice, and listening to the views of staff, pupils and parents
- selecting and appointing a headteacher following the resignation of the current headteacher
- making decisions about issues such as pupil exclusions and staff disciplinary matters
- undertaking induction training and ongoing development

This term has gone by incredibly quickly and new students to our academy have settled in really well! In these difficult times, please can I remind parents/carers that we have a range of hardly worn, second hand uniform (some of which still has labels!) which once cleaned, we donate to anyone who asks, so if you need any uniform then please contact Rob Graves, Associate Principal.

Shortly, Year 11 and Year 13 have their mock examinations, which provide students with a valuable opportunity to assess where they are at this point in the course, learn which topics they need to work on and improve their understanding and explore misconceptions. I wish them the best of luck in their preparation for these.

Finally, on Thursday Professor Hubbard and I led a very successful session at MK:U with all the Sixth Form leads from across the county. This was part of a project funded by the Connelly Foundation and includes almost every Sixth Form in Bedfordshire, along with universities such as Oxford, Cambridge, Bedford, Cranfield and Hertfordshire. The aim of the project is to increase the aspirations of Sixth Form students in Bedfordshire and to share good practice.







During the pandemic we joined with Robert Bloomfield and Shefford Lower School to hold a joint online remembrance service. The event was incredibly moving and brought together over 3000 students and staff, to hear readings, poems and closing with the last post played by one of our Sixth Form students on the trumpet. The feedback and comments from last year's



event were so positive and heart-warming, that we held the service online once again this year, streamed live to classrooms across Shefford/Clifton. Remembrance day is a special time for all schools, but for our three schools it is even more important, as we have many military families from the two local bases.



Over the course of this week our students have crafted individual poppies during tutor time. The poppies have been collated and arranged by each tutor group to create a remembrance poppy wreath that were displayed during our Remembrance Service and later around the academy.

Our SWA arts and crafts staff crocheted individual poppies for each staff member to be worn over the course of the week. Staff donated to The Poppy Appeal and discussed with students its symbolism, which we feel embodies many of our school values.

Our Year 9 students were tasked with writing a poem for Remembrance Day during their recent Engaging Minds lesson. Our staff had the tough decision to select the top three poems. They were super impressed with the quality, volume and effort from the year group. A huge well done to William J.K who won the overall competition, and runners up Lilly M and Barnabas K (which we will try to include at least one poem in February).

This year serves to commemorate 40 years since The Falklands War. Year 11 student Charlie has written the following short piece:

What was The Falklands War?

The Falklands War was a conflict between Britain and Argentina when, on April 2nd 1982, Argentina illegally invaded and annexed the British overseas territory of the Falkland Islands. Despite negotiations through the UN, Argentina refused to withdraw from the islands. In response the Prime Minister, Margaret Thatcher, sent a task force of 127 ships and 4,000 troops to recapture the islands. Ultimately, Britain succeeded; however, this short conflict was bloody conflict: in 2 months and 12 days, 256 British soldiers were killed and 5 ships were sunk.

Lieutenant Colonel Herbert Jones VC was the commanding officer of 2nd Battalion (2 PARA) of the Parachute Regiment from 1960 to 1982. He led his battalion through The Falklands from the first landings at San Carlos Bay until his death at The Battle of Goose Green.

On the 28th May 1982 after the capture of Darwin Ridge, his Battalion was ordered to capture the settlement of Goose Green. Unknown to him there were 1,200 Argentine soldiers entrenched around the settlement outnumbering his 690 strong battalion. During the assault, Jones' unit was pinned down by heavy fire from nearby Argentine trenches. Noticing that his battalion was suffering and casualties were mounting he disregarded his own safety and led a charge encouraging his men to move forward whilst firing his submachine gun. He was killed during this act but the Argentinian position surrendered shortly afterwards. For his actions, he was posthumously awarded the Victoria Cross, Britain's highest award for bravery. The next day, Goose Green was liberated. H Jones was the highest ranking officer to be killed in action during the conflict, but this act, without a doubt, helped in the liberation of Goose Green. He showed great leadership, courage and commitment to his troops, sacrificing his life attempting to save the lives of his men.

Wrest Park

Wrest Park is a 93 acre estate situated in Silsoe, some 8 miles and 15 minutes' drive from Clifton. The estate is run by English Heritage, a national charity that cares for over 400 historic buildings, monuments and sites - from world-famous prehistoric sites like Stonehenge, grand medieval castles like Dover and Tintagel, to Roman forts, Hadrian's Wall and even a Cold War bunker.

A house has stood on the Wrest Park estate since 1633 and the present French style mansion was completed in 1839. Its grounds and gardens were worked on by Capability Brown and contain a building designed by one of English most prestigious architects, Thomas Archer. It is a truly magnificent place to visit and Wrest welcomed over 160.000 visitors last year.



Like most English Heritage sites, Wrest is very dependent on volunteers who bring the buildings and grounds to life for visitors, and our annual recruitment drive has now started.

We need volunteers to act as stewards in the gardens and on the estate, staff our busy second hand book shop, help with conservation in our repository, run our plant and garden sales area, meet and greet our visitors, help maintain the beautiful ornamental gardens and act as guides in the Mansion staterooms.

Full training is given and travel expenses from your home to the park (and return) are paid. A uniform is also provided, and you will be working with a friendly, supportive and dedicated volunteer team. Once established as a volunteer you will also receive free English Heritage membership and discount in our shops and cafes.
