Year 11 students have received their reports which include a wealth of information on how they can improve over the coming months in preparation for their next set of mocks in March. This is an incredibly important time of year for these students who should hopefully already have a detailed revision timetable for the next few weeks as their revision continues.

This year Professor Hubbard and I are leading a project, along with Kimberley College, funded by the Connelly Foundation. The project, which includes working with nearly all Sixth Forms in our county, is focusing on raising the aspirations of over 5000 students currently studying in Year 12 and Year 13. We are working in partnership with Oxford, Cambridge, Cranfield, Bedford, MK:U and The University of Hertfordshire. We are also working with employers such as National Rail. Several meetings with the heads of Sixth Form have taken place, but last week it was the turn of the students. A group of SWA students from The Society led a conference for over 80 students from 14 schools. Activities were all planned and delivered by our students and included taking the delegates through the process of setting up their own Society in their schools. Prof Hubbard was incredibly proud of all the students and the event was a huge success.

We have started the year with some early silverware: the U15 girls basketball team were crowned county champions! The U16 boys' football teams are still in the nationals with wins last week. Last Friday evening, the U14, 15, 17 and 1st XV rugby teams played St Joseph's of Ipswich at the Bedford Athletic ground. It was a fantastic night of rugby. This should be excellent preparation for the upcoming matches in the national vase in March. Thank you to all supporters who braved the cold conditions and supported our boys.

Finally, last week we heard the sad news that Sir Samuel Whitbread had passed away peacefully. He was a keen supporter of the academy and the land the school is built upon was donated by the family over 50 years ago. As Principal of SWA, I had the pleasure of meeting him on a number of occasions, when he came to the school to present the 'Sir Samuel Whitbread House Cup' at our annual awards evenings. He was always genuinely interested in the students' achievements and keen to hear about their future plans and aspirations. We send our heartfelt condolences to the family at this difficult time.







Anti-Social Behaviour

Most residents will be aware of and deplore the antisocial behaviour taking place around the shelter on the playing field. Recently this has included using and dealing in illegal drugs, playing loud music at inappropriate times, using foul language, riding motorcycles on the playing field, throwing stones at



residents using the Community Centre, vandalising property and lighting fires serious enough to require the attendance of the Fire Service. Such activity is intolerable.

Your Parish Council is very aware that when a minority engage in this type of behaviour it blights other people's lives and makes our community a less pleasant place in which to live. In order to combat antisocial behaviour, meetings have been held with the Police and the relevant personnel at CBC. Furthermore, a high-definition CCTV system has been installed which overlooks most of the playing field including, naturally, the shelter. More recently the Parish Council have escalated their approach and are now co-ordinating with the Police at a higher level and this has had an immediate and positive effect. However, there are limits on what any Parish Council can do and what resources the police can deploy.

The prevalence of crime often induces a feeling of helplessness in us all as individuals, but in fact there <u>are</u> things that we can all do to help.

 If you see anti-social behaviour taking place anywhere in the village, contact the police using the 101 telephone service or their website. The police have recommended using their webchat option as being the quickest and most efficient. (Simply type "Bedfordshire Police" into your search engine and click on "contact us" where you will find the webchat).

Police patrols are based, in part, upon the number and frequency of reported incidents, so every report you make helps!

- Please do not post a "furniture free to be collected from outside your property" type message on social media. All too often this quickly finds its way to the shelter and is set alight.
- Most importantly, if you have adolescent children make sure you

know where they are and what they are doing in the evening. We all know how difficult this can be, we were young once! However, it is believed most trouble is caused by a few ringleaders and it is all too easy for young people to be influenced by peer pressure and drawn into trouble.

- If you are a dog walker, horse rider or simply a concerned citizen and want to join the Dog Watch, Horse Watch or Neighbourhood Watch schemes please contact the Parish Clerk or a Parish Councillor. These schemes provide a route whereby suspicious activity can be directly reported, in strict confidence, to the Police.
- Finally, you will see below a recruitment drive for Special Police Officers and PCSOs in this area.

Clifton is a great village. Let's keep it that way.
